Summary of January 5, 2022 CACNR virtual meeting

- A special presentation was made by Emily Tranter, Executive Director of the National Organization to Insure a Sound Controlled Environment (N.O.I.S.E.). CACNR Chair Brad Pierce is President of N.O.I.S.E.
 - Ms. Tranter described the funding for aviation included in the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) approved by Congress.
 - Ms. Tranter also discussed the Continuous Lower Energy, Emissions, and Noise Program (CLEEN) investment to go to aircraft companies to improve aircraft emissions and reduce noise levels by producing quieter aircraft. CLEEN is the FAA's principal environmental effort to accelerate the development of new aircraft and engine technologies.
- We discussed the new 5G technology and its possible effects on commercial aircraft navigation.
- One member of the public thanked airport staff for placing and picking up the portable noise monitor which had been at his location.
- The draft summary report of our virtual meeting with roundtable members, elected officials and flight schools facilitated by Jason Schwartz was discussed.
- Mike Fronapfel talked about a development application submitted to the City of Centennial for live/work units on commercial property that is very close to the airport.
- We discussed having a few people from the roundtable attend the UC Davis Aviation Noise and Emissions Symposium

Summary of February 2, 2022 CACNR virtual meeting

- A special presentation was made by Kristine Chipman, who runs the Aspen Flying Club.
 - Her instructors are aware of places to avoid and try to fly at the highest altitude possible. However they need to comply with altitude limits of the various classes of airspace
 - Ms. Chipman talked about the southwest and southeast training area
 - Ms. Chipman she is in the beginning stages of creating a new southeast practice area for Aspen Flying Club east of Kiowa.
 - Ms. Chipman was invited to attend future CACNR meetings

- Public Comment
 - One member of the public attended our virtual meeting. Focus was on noise from the flight schools in the southeast training area. Ms. Chipman and the member of the public had a very productive conversation

- Executive Work / Plan Committee
 - Paul Krier was elected Vice Chair of the CACNR. The previous Vice Chair, Melissa Coudeyras left Castle Pines City Council in January
 - All jurisdictions, with the exception of Arapahoe County and Castle Rock, have paid their 2022 Invoices

- Fly Quiet Committee
 - They are a) working toward discussing, developing and implementing incentives for voluntary use of fly quiet procedures and b) examining how committees, noise monitoring systems, and hotlines are structured and utilized at other airports similar to KAPA.

- Executive Director's Report
 - Mike Fronapfel discussed possible state legislation pertaining laser pointers being aimed at pilots

- UC Davis Aviation and Emissions Symposium
 - We will have 2 attendees, 1 in person & 1 virtually
