

## Meeting Notes from the March 2, 2022, CACNR for the ACPAA on March 10, 2022

- Election of CACNR Officers – The present slate of officers was re-elected for a one - year term. Brad Pierce, Chair; Paul Krieser, Vice Chair; Andy Jones, Treasurer and Alison Biggs, Secretary
- Brad Pierce Chair reported the committee reviewed the Flight School Engagement Summary Report from Jason Schwarz. Revisions are being made. Flight school follow ups continue.
- Bill Wasmund reported the pattern at the airport is saturated. ATCT is routing traffic to other satellite airports.
- Alison Biggs asked members to volunteer ideas for the Work Plan which is set to be revised this year. She will send the current workplan to CACNR members.
- Candace Moon reported there is an issue with the portable noise monitor at Highlands Ranch. Samantha Blymyer reported the noise monitor is offline and they are working with AT&T to resolve the issue.
- Members of the public were given a chance to make comments: Two voiced concerns about flight schools training over their homes for long durations of time – specifically Aspen Flying Club and Flights Inc. Response was given that CACNR plans to coordinate with at least one flight school per future Roundtable Meeting to address noise burdens caused by training traffic. Another member of the public happily announced that she has observed progress since her noise inquiries last October.
- A discussion was had regarding the option of in-person attendance for future CACNR meetings. It was agreed that given COVID cases remain low, future meetings will be held in-person for Roundtable members *and* the public with a virtual option still available.
